ABOUT THE FUND

Partners for Places enhances local capacity to build equitable and sustainable communities in the United States and Canada. These awards support the planning and implementing of equitable climate action and green stormwater infrastructure projects.

To date, Partners for Places has awarded more than \$9 million across North America, generating more than \$19 million in additional community investments.

The Funders Network (TFN) and the Urban Sustainability Directors Network (USDN) launched the Local Sustainability Matching Fund in 2012, now called Partners for Places. The program is supported by <u>The JPB</u> <u>Foundation</u>, <u>The Kendeda Fund</u>, <u>The Kresge Foundation</u>, <u>The New York Community Trust</u>, <u>The Allen H. and Selma</u> <u>W. Berkman Charitable Trust</u>, and <u>the Pisces Foundation</u>.
