Partners for Places: Core Grant Program

Since 2012, our core grant program has forged meaningful partnerships between **community groups, local governments** and **funders**, fueling:

- More than 200 projects and \$25 million in community-driven investments.
- **GSI grants** : Includes 39 collaborative GSI projects and \$2.4 million in GSI funding.

Funding Opportunity:

TFN has launched a \$10 million campaign to scale this proven model within three years — expanding impact into both urban and rural communities.



Partners for Places: NEW Funding Track

The Jobs & Inclusive Infrastructure Initiative will:

- Accelerate business growth and help train, employ and expand career pathways for local workers in critical climate-resilient sectors — like green infrastructure, renewable energy, transportation, and water management.

Funding Opportunity:

The first round of investments will have a strong emphasis on place-based water-related projects.

TFN anticipates at least half of the projects will focus on water project implementation, although those working in other infrastructure areas may apply.
